

# Paper Recycling

## ACCEPTED ITEMS AND PREPARATION

## DO NOT INCLUDE

**Newspapers** Newspapers and all flyers stack them in your blue box

**Do not** bag, tie or bundle newspapers



**Mixed Paper**

**Junk mail**, office paper, magazines, telephone books, cards, bags, etc. **Shredded paper** must be bagged and tied in a clear bag

**No** metallic or glitter gift wrap/cards **No** photographs **No** used tissues or paper towels or any other contaminated paper **No** paper beverage cups **No** bows or ribbons



**Boxboard**

**Boxes** for cereal, crackers, pasta, shoe boxes, paper towel centre cores **Milk & juice** cartons, rinsed **Paper** egg cartons

**Remove** plastic windows from pasta and tissue boxes **Remove** inside bags and liners



**Corrugated Cardboard**

**Corrugated** boxes must be flattened Tie in bundles, max. size: 24" x24"x36". Place bundles on top of blue box **Max. weight** of 20lbs per bundle **Staples** and tape okay **Remove** all food residue and contents from pizza boxes

**No** cardboard that has been contaminated with oil or chemicals



**Blue Box Pick Up**  
Your recycling should be placed at ground level (not on top of snow banks) at the end of your driveway by **6 a.m.** on the same day as your garbage to guarantee pickup.

Depending on the weather and volume, your area's collection time may vary.

Blue Boxes can be purchased at the Township Office at a cost of **\$7 each.**

Items must be paid for by cash or cheque only and picked up at the Township Office.

# Container Recycling

## ACCEPTED ITEMS AND PREPARATION

## DO NOT INCLUDE

**Glass Bottles and Jars**

**Food & beverage** glass bottles and jars **Clear** and coloured glass **Avoid** breaking glass **Remove** lids and rinse container **Recycle** metal lids; discard plastic ones

**No** light bulbs of any type **No** mirror or window glass **No** drinking glasses\* **No** ceramics\* **No** Broken glass (wrap, label & place with garbage)

\*Consider donating



**Plastic #1 through #7 + Grocery Bags**

**Bottles** and tubs with #1-#7 symbol (not #3 & #6) **Laundry**, cleaner, soap and shampoo bottles with #1-#7 (not #3 & #6)

**No** motor oil or chemical Containers\* **No** over-wrap, bubble wrap, baggies or liners **No** food wrap **No** bags with hard plastic handles, drawstrings or metal detail **No** plastic cutlery or straws

**#3 & #6 NOT Accepted**

**Plastic** grocery bags (stuff into one bag and tie handles securely) **Empty** and rinse all containers. Keep lids and sprayers on

\*Bring to Hazardous Waste Day



**Aluminum & Tin Cans**

**ALL** food & beverage cans & lids **Clean** aluminum foil containers **Empty** & rinse cans **Labels** are okay **Aluminum** foil with no grease

**No** aerosol or paint cans **No** cooking pots or pans **No** other metal items **No** paper-backed foil **No** foil Laminates (potato chip bags)

**Did you know?**  
The landfill sites in South Glengarry are also equipped with recycling stations! So you can bring your recycling to the landfill sites for free as long as your vehicle is registered.

**How to properly dispose of tires**  
You can bring old tires to the Township's landfill sites. Check the landfill schedule for times.

Compost is a natural process in which organic materials decompose, and become a nutrient-rich soil amendment.

Compost is ready when it feels like a wrung-out sponge.

**What to put in a composter**

<u>YES</u>	<u>NO</u>
Fruit and vegetable scraps	Pet manure or kitty litter
Tea bags	Meat, bones, fat
Egg shells	Dairy products
Coffee grounds and filters	Diseased/bug infested plants
Nut shells	Oil and oily foods
Wood ash	Diapers or sanitary products
Plant trimmings	Barbecue ashes
Dry leaves	Egg yolk and white
Wood chips/charcoal	Fish and seafood

**How to dispose of Household Hazardous Waste**

The Household Hazardous Waste Day in South Glengarry is Saturday, September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2016 from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (Noon) at Smithfield Park, 119 Military Road,

In addition, residents of South Glengarry can dispose of Household Hazardous Waste and Electronic Waste at the City of Cornwall depot on Cornwall Centre Road. For more information visit: [www.cornwall.ca](http://www.cornwall.ca)

Cleaners	Monitors
Waxes	Computers
Detergent	Televisions
Cosmetics	Printers
Prescriptions	Faxes
Paints	Cell phones
Oils	Cameras

**How should I transport hazardous waste?**  
For your protection, deliver toxic materials wrapped and labeled in the trunk of your car. Do not mix materials.  
Bulk your paints: latex with latex, oil-based with oil-based.

**How come the Township does not recycle #3 & #6 plastic?**  
The recycling contractor does not have the facilities to recycle this plastic.

**How do I ensure our compost does not smell unpleasant?**  
Aerate your compost regularly by turning it, burying fruit and veggie scraps at least 15cm deep and make sure you are putting compostable items

**How long will it take to compost?**  
3 to 18 months, depending on how well you maintain it.
