Further to our discussion the geotechnical team has reviewed well records in the immediate area of the proposed water tower. The purpose of this review was to assess the anticipated soil conditions and to comment on the suitability of the subsoils regarding a potential building site for the proposed water tower. Four well records were available for review namely;

- Well 2305333
- Well 2300021
- Well 2300020
- Well 2304512

A copy of the well records and site location plan is attached for reference.

Based on our review we offer below the following summary of the anticipated soil conditions in the region of the proposed site:

- Sandy Glacial Till, (Ranging from Surface to 6.0 m) over
- Gravelly Glacial Till (Ranging from 3.6 m, 17.4 m, although Well 2300020 indicated 33.6 m), over
- Limestone Bedrock

The materials were generally found to be within a dense state however loose material was noted in two of the wells from 15.0 m to 17.1 m and 24.0 m to 28.5 m before transitioning back to dense material and/or refusal within the limestone bedrock surface.



The materials noted within the well records are consistent with that presented within Chapmad and Putnam as described below:

The subject property is located within the Lancaster Flats physiographic region (Chapman and Putnam, 1984). Chapman and Putnam (1984) describe this area as a lowland where the till plain has been buried below water-laid deposits (Chapman and Putman, 1984).

Surficial geology in the study area consists of two soil units (Ontario Geological Survey, 2003);

• Fine textured glaciomarine deposits of silt and clay, minor sand and gravel, massive to well laminated, are generally located within the western half of the subject property.

• Stone-poor sandy silt to silty sand textured till on Paleozoic terrain is generally located within the eastern half of the subject property.

Bedrock geology in the study area consists of limestone, dolostone, shale, arkose, and sandstone of the Ottawa and Simcoe Groups, Shadow Lake Formation (Lumbers, 1976).

Based on the limited desk-top review of the subsoils within the immediate area of the proposed water tower site it appears there are three founding subsoils as follows:

- The shallower sandy glacial till extending to around 6.0 m;
- The deeper gravelly glacial till extending to around 17.0 m; and
- The limestone bedrock encountered around 17.0 m below existing site grades.



- To assess the short-listed alternatives, a criteria assessment table was developed. A rating system assigned numeric values to each of the identified criteria; 1 = Worst;
- 2 = Moderate; 3 = Best.
- The criteria incorporated the advantages and disadvantages of each type of elevated storage.
- Water quality, access to storage and capital cost criteria were weighted double values as these were considered of higher importance.
- Estimated capital costs for both alternatives are statistically the same the August, 2022 tender price for a composite water tower in Lucknow, Ontario was \$6,000,000.
- Even taking into account a shorter life expectancy, major maintenance costs for the glass-lined option are about two-thirds those of the composite option.
- Routine O&M costs for both alternatives are statistically the same.

Good afternoon Mr. Little,

We are working on preparing revised project estimates for the Water Tower project. The estimate we are working from is two-years old and, as you likely know, costs have been incredibly volatile in that time. The Mayor is correct that a comparable project in another municipality (2022) was approximately \$6,000,000. Will this be the pricing that South Glengarry receives, I'm really not sure. However, the Township has secured \$1,988,800 in federal funding and \$1,657,168 in provincial funding for this project. If you are interested, the display boards from the Public Information Centre (PIC) are available online:

https://www.southglengarry.com/en/municipal-services/resources/Documents/122083-Glen-Walter-Water-Tower-Watermain-Replacement-PIC-Presentation-MASTER.pdf

To your question to how much the Water Tower will cost residents. If you are not on the Glen Walter municipal water system, then likely \$0. If you are on the Glen Walter municipal water system, then it will likely be through a capital repayment charge over time. We have not advanced the project far enough to have those details worked out though. When they are available, we will share them!

In terms of communication of the PIC, we reached out in a number of ways:

Thank you for your correspondence, dated May 3, 2023 regarding the proposed Glen Walter Tower & Watermain Replacement (the Project) proposed by the Township of South Glengarry.

The Impact Assessment Act (the IAA) sets out the federal process for assessing the impacts of certain major projects, including the assessment of positive and negative environmental, economic, health and social effects that are within the legislative authority of the Parliament of Canada. The *Physical Activities Regulations* (the Regulations) under the IAA identify the physical activities that constitute the "designated projects" that are subject to the IAA and may require an impact assessment. Proponents of designated projects are required to submit an Initial Project Description to the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (the Agency) to inform a determination of whether an impact assessment is required.

Based on the information provided, the proposed project does not appear to include physical activities that are described in the Regulations.

Should details or design aspects of the Project change such that the Project may include physical activities that are described in the Regulations, contact the Agency to discuss these changes and the implications on the applicability of the IAA.

Canada

Please note that for physical activities not described in the Regulations, subsection 9(1) of the IAA provides that the Minister of Environment and Climate Change (the Minister) may designate a physical activity. The Minister may designate on request or on his or her own initiative. A physical activity may be designated if the Minister is of the opinion that the carrying out of that activity may cause adverse effects within federal jurisdiction or adverse direct or incidental effects (resulting from federal decisions), or if public concerns related to those effects warrant the designation. Should the Minister designate the physical activity it would be considered a designated project and an Initial Project Description would be required.

Should the Project be carried out in whole or in part on federal lands, section 82 of the IAA would apply if any federal authority is required to exercise a power, duty or function under an Act other than IAA in order for the Project to proceed, or is providing financial assistance for the purpose of enabling the Project to be carried out. In that case, that federal authority must ensure that any Project assessment requirements under those provisions are satisfied.

In addition, other federal regulatory permits, authorizations and/or licences may still be required.


